

Mary as Queen

A few days ago, we celebrated the Queenship of our Blessed Virgin Mary. It was a day (and still is) dedicated to rejoicing that our Mother is also the Queen of Heaven and Earth. Yet Mary's title as Queen of Heaven and Earth is a great scandal to many non-Catholic Christians. After all, the Bible doesn't mention anything about there being a queen in God's kingdom. All this royal attention Catholics give to Mary---whether it is singing "Hail, Holy Queen Enthroned Above" or "Queen of Apostles" or other songs along with Mary in statues and paintings with a crown on her head----seems too many non-Catholics to detract from the royalty of Christ, who alone is the King of Kings. Besides, how could Mary be a queen since she is not the wife of Jesus but only his mother?

There are a few biblical passages that shed some light on this topic. One is the topic of the queen in the Old Testament. In the rule of King David as well as other ancient kingdoms, the mother of the ruling king held an important office in the royal court and played a key role in the process of dynastic succession. In fact, it is the king's mother, not his wife that ruled as queen. Ancient Kings had many wives but only one mother. Her royal office is also described by Jeremiah, who tells how the queen mother possessed a throne and a crown, symbolic of her position of authority in the kingdom: "Say to the king and the queen mother: 'Take a lowly seat, for your beautiful crown has come down from your head. . . . Lift up your eyes and see those who come from the north. Where is the flock that was given you, your beautiful flock?" (Jer. 13:18, 20). It is significant that God directed this oracle about the upcoming fall of Judah to both the king and his mother. Addressing both the king and the queen mother, Jeremiah portrays her as sharing in her son's rule over the kingdom. Let's also look at Bathsheba, the wife of King David. She always bowed when David entered. But as the mother of King Solomon, she was seated at the right hand of the king. Sitting at his right hand symbolized her great power given by the king. Her power was second only to the king.

Second, we have the queen in the Book of Revelation in the New Testament. We read in Catholic.com "She can be seen in the great vision described in Revelation 12: "And a great portent appeared in heaven, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars; she was with child and she cried out in her pangs of birth, in anguish for delivery" (Rev. 12:1–2). Who is this newborn child? He is described as the messianic king exercising his dominion. In verse 5, this king is described as one to "rule all the nations with a rod of iron" (Rev. 12:5, Ps. 2:9). This royal son is taken up to heaven to sit on a throne (Rev. 12:5), and he ushers in the kingdom of God by defeating the devil: "Now the kingdom of our God has come, for the accuser has been thrown down" (12:10). Certainly, this newborn child is the royal Messiah, King Jesus." And his mother is Mary.

Remember the wedding feast at Cana, how Mary came to Jesus and told Him they were about to run out of wine? "How does this concern Me? My hour has not yet come." Jesus said. Mary simply told the waiters to do whatever He tells you. They do. And Jesus changes water into wine. God glorified Mary by crowning her Queen. We celebrate it in the fifth decade of the Rosary. St. Gregory comments, "God the Father looks upon Mary's honor as if it were His own. God the Son, taking delight in her, grants her every petition as if He were paying a debt." Let us turn to Mary and ask for her to join with us in seeking God's mercy.
