

THE TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

What a Wonderful Day ???

I hope and pray that you are having a wonderful day. Many things happening here in your life this day. Can we take a few minutes and think about heaven? To think about the joy and what it would be like for us? Just about all of us think we will be there. We believe we will be there either instantly upon death or very soon after. We think of an enjoyable visit like going to a sports game, a trip to Disnevland. or some other really fun time we have had here. Most people will think of doing things with other people. Yet none of these events even come close to it. When we do finally close our eyes for the last time in this life and open them in the next, we will see God Himself. The fantastic moment of that event is something so great we can't even begin to describe it. Even a saint in heaven would be speechless trying to come up with words to describe it. St. Paul has given us just a few words, from a vision, trying to describe a foretaste of heaven. All he could say was "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor has it entered into the heart of man to see what God has prepared for those who love Him."

Still, we can and do try to get a glimpse of what the joy of heaven may be like. If we have been fortunate enough to have experienced joy here, we begin with that as an example. Even though it is inadequate, we look back to that time of exquisite happiness whenever and wherever it was. Think of some major joy here on earth, like our wedding, a newborn baby placed in your arms, or some other joyous event. Whatever it was, try to multiply the joy by a hundred million and we will still fall far short in our imagination of being in the presence of God. Even our greatest leaps of imagination fall far short. God is infinitely lovable! This means He will be infinitely irresistible. The very sight of Him will siphon love out of us as the heart of a tornado sucks water out of a lake as it passes over. Welling up from our very roots, up from our toes, love will rush out of us to God. And that will not be enough. No matter what it is, we are also certain that our love will be returned. There will be no doubt, of that, when God catches us up into His love.

God is love. He is infinite love! He made us because of His love for us. When the barrier of earthly life is removed, God will swamp us with His love. It will rock us. It will all but tear us apart with its intensity. Right now, even the most prideful person among us cannot claim to be the most lovable person in all creation. That's because we all secretly recognize that we have some pretty unlovable spots in our past. Thank God for the gift of purgatory. It is God's wash-up station where we will be totally purified. Cleansed of all sin and in the original beauty of the soul with which God endowed us, we shall find we are incredibly lovable. God will prove it to us as His love for us envelops us and carries us to the heights of ecstasy.

One final item: This joy will never end! Have you never exclaimed, "Oh! I wish that this could go on forever! I wish it didn't have to end!" That will be heaven. It is eternal. It has no end.

Let the thought of heaven inspire you.

Let the thought of God fill your mind and soul.

Let it fill your soul with a prayer of love and thanksgiving to God.
