How much do you think about the angels? Not very much, if even any? For some people, angels are nothing more than a childhood memory

similar to the tooth fairy or the Easter bunny. For others, the word pulls up an image of Clarence, the harmless, slightly bumbling elderly angel

from the movie It's a Wonderful Life, who has not yet managed to earn his wings. And some people think of them as spirits who are limited to the halls of heaven where they worship God night and day.

Angels do worship God but they also do much, much more. They are God's faithful servants, always ready to do anything for Him. Next Sunday, the 29th of September is normally the feast day for the archangels Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael but because it is Sunday they will be skipped in favor of the 25th feast day of the year. Pope Gregory the Great talked about the angels in a homily saying "The word angel denotes a function, not a nature. Those holy spirits of heaven have always been spirits. We call them angels when they are sent on a mission by God. Those who deliver messages of lesser importance are called angels and those who proclaim messages of supreme importance are called archangels." So it was that the archangel Gabriel who was sent to the Virgin Mary to ask if she would be willing to become the mother of Jesus. It was fitting that this great message would be brought by an archangel!

The names given to the angels denote their ministry when they are sent to us. Gabriel is called the "Strength of God," Raphael is "God's Remedy," and Michael means "Who is like God?" Gabriel, who is called, God's Strength, is always present as the bearer of good news. In addition to his message to Our Mother Mary, he also announced to Zachariah that he and his wife would be the parents of a child they were to name John. There is no greater delight in a family than the birth of a child because Zachariah didn't believe, he was struck dumb until after the child was born and named John. And the best announcement of course was the upcoming birth of our Savior! Thus, God's Strength spoke of the mighty power of our Lord. Raphael, God's Remedy, brings messages and actions of healing. He touched the eyes of Tobit to cure him, banishing the darkness of his being blind. When some act of wondrous power must be performed, Michael is sent, so that his action and his name makes it clear that no one can do what God decrees. Michael the Archangel appeared in the Old Testament several times. He defends the chosen people on God's behalf. He also appears in the Book of Revelation in the final battle with the devil Satan.

This battle with the forces of evil is not limited to the pages of Scripture but is ongoing in our lives. Pope John Paul II taught, "The continuous struggle with the devil that characterizes Michael the archangel is still going on since the devil, who seeks to take advantage of every situation, is still living and operative in the world...We have the impression today that people do not want to see the problem. Everything possible is done to remove from public awareness the existence of the 'cunning attacks of the devil' who holds dominion over the underworld as spoken in Ephesians. St. Peter encouraged the early Christians to be vigilant. "Be sober and watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion seeking souls to devour (1Pet5:7-8). Perhaps the greatest triumph of Satan and his followers is that today many question his existence. They say the belief in angels was a mistaken belief of culturally backward people. Let us not forget. Their action in the life of the world and their influence on people is real and effective. May we frequently seek the help of angels and archangels. St. Michael the archangel, defend us in battle. Be our safeguard against the wickedness and snares of the devil...
