Two weeks ago, in my article about indulgences, I neglected to mention visiting a cemetery, especially during the month of November which is dedicated to prayers for the deceased. We used to lock up our cemetery beginning on the first of November for the winter. Now we leave it open until the first of December for additional time to stop in to pray.

I was also asked what passages in the Bile mentioned purgatory. One of course is 2 Maccabees 12:43-46. Here Judas Maccabee took up a collection and sent it to Jerusalem to pray for the sins killed in battle. If they were in hell, no prayer would be helpful. If already in heaven, no prayer was needed for them for they were already in the perfect glory of heaven with almighty God. This passage only makes sense if they were in a place of being purified of their sins which is what purgatory is. This passage only makes sense if one is in need of getting cleaned up before entering into heaven. Revelation 21:27 tells us that "Nothing profane shall enter heaven, nor anyone who is a liar or has done a detestable act." Purgatory is the way that the righteous are made perfect, according to Hebrews 12:22-23. Hebrews goes on to tell us, beginning in verse 25 that "for if the Israelites did not escape punishment when they refused to listen as God spoke to them on earth, how much greater punishment will be ours if we turn away from Him who speaks from heaven!" We have been warned. In Matthew 5:26 Jesus said, "I warn you, you will not be released until you have paid the last penny." As we already mentioned it's not hell for there is no payment and those in hell despise God. It is an image of purgatory. Jesus is telling us to change our lives now, to forgive and repent now. If we do not, we will still have to deal with those sins after death. It's so much better to do so now.

How many times have we thought too little of those who have gone before us, leaving us with the signs of faith in following Jesus Christ? Or have we, like so many other members of the human race been so wrapped up in thoughts of ourselves and, immersed in the trifles of today, totally forgetful of our future life in eternity? It should be enough for us to know that those who have gone before are stretching out their hands to us for help, crying, Have pity on me! Pray for me!" Yet to remember the dead with anything beyond a temporary thought is the exception. We may make an effort to pray for them in the first few days of our losing them to death. But mostly we don't. Even when we visit a cemetery or go to church, do we pray for our loved ones who have died? We let ourselves off any concern for them by claiming they are in heaven right now and thus we don't need to do a thing. Let us change! Let us pray for the souls in purgatory.

Let us also remember to have a Mass or Masses said for them. We used to have lots of Masses said for them but over the last several decades it has died off. So many no longer do anything. Stop by the parish office and ask for a Mass for them. Most generally an offering of \$10 per Mass is made but it can be less.

When one desires to gain a favor from God or through the intercession of Mary or one of the Saints, we often we sometimes say, "If this favor is granted, I will do this or that." Far more preferable is to give beforehand what we intend to do. Remember the command of Christ to "give, and it shall be given to you." St. John Bosco reminds us the Lord didn't say, "Promise to give and it shall be given to you," but rather, "give first and then you shall receive!"
